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PROFILE

Founder of Hello Tham, a boutique strategy consulting company. Available for short to medium term consulting engagements spanning strategic business change, business and operating model design, business process improvement, and technology strategy, architecture and solutions.

My career has now spanned four decades and I am looking forward to entering the fifth:

- In the first decade I started as an analyst for a fintech, and then a financial institution. I pivoted to be a systems and architecture consultant for two of the biggest computer companies in the world: AT&T/NCR and HP.
- In the second decade I pivoted back to Banking and Finance. I established and managed successful strategy and architecture functions in several institutions including MLC, NAB and ING.
- In the third decade I transitioned to become a strategy consultant and have delivered successful engagements to Transfield Services, Broadspectrum and Transport for NSW.
- In the fourth decade I am working on things that interest and matter to me. I teach at Torrens University, and have continued my consulting career. I have also written a book, AI-dō.

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- **Flexible strategic change agent and thought leader** — I have facilitated business and technology strategic change for three decades – from Head of Strategy positions at MLC, NAB and ING to delivering IT strategies, roadmaps and operating models as a consultant to Transfield Services and Transport for NSW (through my consulting company Hello Tham).
- **Successful and proven technology strategy and architecture leader** — I have built successful architecture practices at organisations from MLC (where I wrote my own job description and built a practice that became a case study at international conferences) to NAB, ING and Broadspectrum. I have provided enterprise architecture advice as a consultant to Transport for NSW and currently at Cochlear.
- **Recognised technology innovator and industry expert** — I have been involved in new technologies for my entire career, from early beginnings managing one of Australia's first commercial UNIX systems at Bain & Co, which I connected to ACSnet in 1986 to make it one of the earliest non-academic organisations in the country online, to a patented service-oriented advice platform my team pioneered at MLC, to using a large language model to classify support calls in 2018, long before ChatGPT. Most recently I shaped Cochlear's AI strategy. I teach Information Systems at Torrens University, and have written AI-dō, a book on using AI effectively.

- Embedded LeanIX into the federated architecture governance model, shifting practice from static document reviews to live fact-sheet-driven governance, metrics, decision evidence and portfolio transparency.

- Defined an architecture service catalogue spanning strategic consulting, business and technology roadmaps, enterprise guidelines, proposal assessment, solution architecture, options analysis and architecture assurance.
- Established reusable deliverables including strategic architecture roadmaps, capability maturity assessments, reference architecture libraries, solution architecture blueprints, integration design specifications, decision support matrices and assurance reports.

Architecture metrics

- Mapped metrics to strategic priorities and executive reporting: repository completeness, strategic initiative coverage, application rationalisation, technology obsolescence risk, technical debt remediation, federated decision ratio, decision velocity, assurance coverage and stakeholder satisfaction.
- Defined a phased dashboard roadmap taking cumulative coverage from 6 of 19 metrics to 13, then to all 19, with increasing integration across Jira, HR, Finance, ADR and survey processes.

AI architecture

- Produced an AI Reference Architecture of modular building blocks, principles, patterns, guardrails and guidelines, balancing enterprise coherence with domain agility across multiple deployment options.
- Established an AI pattern taxonomy spanning foundational, contextual and agentic patterns, from AI model access and AI-native DevOps through to personal agents, agentic process automation and external-facing agents.
- Defined architecture controls for agentic AI including unique agent identity, least privilege, lifecycle controls, data and model governance, monitoring and observability, human oversight and audit evidence, aligned to ISO/IEC 42001 and ISO/IEC 23894.

Digital adoption

- Positioned WalkMe as a governed enterprise platform to accelerate adoption of growth-enabling systems such as Salesforce and SAP, with guardrails covering business process ownership of content, certified content builders, SailPoint integration, SSO alignment, Privacy Impact Assessment requirements and PII masking.
